NOTES

- (1) This budget relates to the **General Funds** of General Meeting for Scotland. Two **Restricted Funds** (supporting teenagers' Link Weekends, and the GM Fund for have been omitted from the 2014 budget, though their accounts will be included with the GM accounts at the year end.
- (2) The AM Quotas were reduced by 10% in 2011 and have been kept at the same level since then.
- (3) GM has been receiving an annual grant of over £6000 from BYM to assist with administrative expenses, as well as a generous annual grant from the Camfield
- (4) The budget assumes that the next List of Members and Attenders will be printed at the end of 2014, with distribution and sales in early 2015. An unpublished supplement will be prepared at the end of 2013.
- (5) Grants, subscriptions and bursaries: Maintained at the same level as in 2013 (note that GM only makes grants to organisations on which it has an active

- (6) Scottish Friend, the GM newsletter, is sent free to Members and Attenders. No income is received from the newsletter, and its costs relate to its printing plus | Increasing numbers of Friends are receiving Scottish Friend by email (i.e. no postage costs).
- (7) Note that, in 2013, the cost of advertising Quaker Week in *The Big Issue* was met by central funds. GM purchased a carrying case for the Scottish Quaker tapestry panel in 2013.
- (8) For information, mileage claims are met at a rate of 25 pence per mile at present.
- (9) Until 2013 insurance for GM was included within the insurance cover taken out by Area Meetings, and no budget was set for 2013.
- (10) The actual out-turn predicted for 2013 is likely to be more positive than anticipated, primarily due to low printing and travel costs.
- (11) The balance predicted for the end of 2013 excludes sums held for teenagers Link Weekends (ca. £550) and for the proposed GM healing fund (ca Note that any accumulated balance would enable GM to support new work on parliamentary advocacy.
