### Quaker Housing Trust, a practical response to the housing crisis

Quaker Housing Trust was set up by Yearly Meeting in 1967, responding to Friends' concerns about housing and homelessness. Unfortunately the need for it is just as real today. As Friends will know, the shortage of social housing and rising private rent costs mean many people do not have a home of their own.

QHT supports housing projects for people in need, particularly those at points of transition in their lives. Recently we have become interested in making loans rather than grants. When these are repaid we lend the money to another project, recycling your donation many times over.

Our small feasibility grants help charities see if their dreams can work in reality. We are currently working with a women's shelter in Glasgow which is hoping to provide longer term accommodation for some of the extremely vulnerable women it supports.

QHT is our Quaker response to the housing crisis. We would love to see more Friends supporting our work.

**Regular donations**, however small, would increase the number of projects we can fund.

Many of us fortunate enough to own our own home have seen house prices increase massively over the past few decades. We have made money just by living in our homes! Friends might consider passing some of this gain on to QHT if they **downsize** or move to a cheaper property.

Or leaving a **legacy** for when we no longer need housing ourselves.
