OTHER EVENTS

Support for Refugees and Asylum Seekers in Glasgow

I recently attended the Scottish Refugee Council AGM on behalf of Glasgow Quaker Meeting, We pay a membership subscription of £75 each year and have also supported various of their fundraising activities.

2023/2024 is the last of their European funding which has been the biggest donor since 2019. This year the Scottish government has provided one years funding specifically for extending resettlement of refugees throughout Scotland. To enable their work to have secure funding in the future they are developing alternative fundraising methods.

Two pieces of legislation from the outgoing government hugely impacted on their work. The Illegal Migrants Act 2023 and the Rwanda Act 2024 were introduced very quickly which make it increasingly difficult to seek asylum in the UK. All charities involved in supporting refugees are advocating hard for a fairer system with the new government.

Some statistics

7,800+ people from 98 countries to rebuild their lives in 30 of Scotland's council areas.

11,000 queries on their helpline

414 people facing destitution and homelessness

1,250 hardship grants applied for to total £154,800 for those in extreme poverty

945 unaccompanied children in partnership with Aberlour

111 volunteers helped with all aspects of their work

366 frontline workers trained on refugee and asylum rights

525 people trained to making recruitment fairer and more accessible to refugees

Quaker Interfaith events in Scottish Interfaith week 11- 18 November.

This year Quakers in Glasgow are preparing two events for Scottishl nterfaith week (SIFW). The first takes place at the St Mungo's Museum on 11th November from 6.15 -

8pm (doors open at 6.00pm) and features 3 prominent members of our Meeting - Nuala Watt poet and disability activist, Alastair MacIntosh writer academic and ecological activist and Mark Coleman artist actor and director.

The theme of the event is the Power of Silence - and how Quaker worship based on Silence acts an impetus for activism, witness and spiritual nurture. The use of Silence is a feature of many spiritual traditions and practices and in the spirit of Interfaith Dialogue there will be opportunities to reflect on the thoughts of speakers and in discussion with fellow participants about different approaches to Silence in different religious practices. This will also be an opportunity to share fellowship across different faiths in the spirit of Discovery - the theme of this years SIFW - a curiosity to learn and share insights across different faiths and beliefs.

In addition, on the 13th November, we are inviting people to join us in our regular Wednesday Meeting for Worship at the Meeting House at 12.30pm to share the stillness for a half hour and then share a simple meal. Afterwards there will be time for informal discussion and fellowship for those able to stay.

In both events we are hoping that Quakers will be willing to support us in coming to the events and sharing their experiences. The event at St Mungo's can booked on Eventbrite. In planning and organising these events we have been greatly helped by Linda Haggerstone who has many years experience in Interfaith work.

Special Collections

The collection on **27 October** will be for the **Quaker Housing Trust**, introduced by Hilary Patrick.

The Quaker Housing Trust was set up by Yearly Meeting in 1967 in response to Friends' concerns about housing and homelessness.

We help create comfortable, secure and long term homes for people in need. We make grants and loans to small and medium-sized charities which provide housing for vulnerable people, particularly people at time of transitions in their lives.

During 2023, QHT made awards totaling just over £140,000. The projects we support are life changing: housing for refugees and asylum seekers, for women who have been trafficked, and for people experiencing street homelessness. Their new homes

are built to high energy efficiency standards; so their running costs are lower, and this also fulfils our sustainability testimony.

Over the years Scottish charities have particularly benefited from QHT grants and loans. Street Connect Glasgow's move on housing for people with drug or alcohol issues. Rural housing projects in Arisaig, Strathglass and the Western Isles. And of course WSAM was one of the first in Britain to receive one of our new Quaker Asset feasibility study grants to see if part of our meeting house could be converted into social housing.

QHT's funding programmes are oversubscribed. There are brilliant charities out there creating housing and we wish we could support more of them. All our money comes from donations and from repayment of loans we have made in the past.

Unfortunately, in recent years, there has been a significant fall in donations made by Meetings and individual Friends. This severely limits what we can do.

Many in our Meeting are concerned about the housing crisis. Supporting QHT could be our Quaker response.

Regular donations, however small, would increase the number of projects we can fund.

Many of us fortunate enough to own our own home have seen house prices increase massively over the past few decades. Friends might consider passing some of this gain onto QHT if they **downsize** or move to a cheaper property. Or leaving a **legacy** for when we no longer need housing ourselves.

We are also encouraging local meetings to consider making QHT one of their **regular** special collections.
