George Fox's letter to Oliver Cromwell - Jan. 1658

"Oliver hadst thou been faithful and thundered down the deceit, the Hollander had been thy subject and tributary, Germany had given up to have done thy will, and the Spaniard had quivered like a dry leaf wanting the virtue of God, the King of France should have bowed his neck under thee, the Pope should have withered as in winter, the Turk in all his fatness should have smoked, thou shouldst not have stood trifling about small things but minded the work of the Lord as he began with thee at first....Let thy soldiers go forth....that thou may rock nations as a cradle."

I understand that the original parchment is at Friends House (Bound Parchment Portfolio 9. p. 79).

It would seem that George Fox encouraged Cromwell and that he supported the activities of the New Model Army as part of God's plan to bring about the 'Kingdom of God' on Earth. Contemporary Quakers are opposed to warfare and therefore tend to disagree with Fox's interpretations of Scripture. Our failure to implement the peace-promoting teachings of Jesus has resulted in the development of W.M.D. and global conflict now threatens all life on planet Earth.
