- Kate Arnot will be our representative on the Open Door committee.
- We agreed to an annual donation to *The Friend*, and a one-off contribution to Wallingford Meeting House appeal. Also to the Steiner School for our meeting there.
- Sun Feb 23 is the preferred (not confirmed) date for our next Meeting for Business. We aim to meet quarterly on 4th Sundays, coinciding with our dates for shared lunch, but date clashes and room availability may alter this.

Climate vigils – Christian Climate Action Scotland continues to hold a vigil outside the Scottish Parliament on the last Tuesday of each month, 12-2 pm.

No more Twitter: X is ex. From Dec 16th BYM and other UK Quaker accounts joined other organisations and individuals who have moved away from posting on Twitter (X), instead using BlueSky (https://bsky.app) and other avenues, because of weakened moderation and increased levels of disinformation on X.
