Mini Mart Coordinator – could this be you?

Mini Mart has been a monthly event at South Edinburgh Meeting on the 1st Sunday of the month for many years. It is the wish of our Meeting is that this regular Social/fundraising event continue if possible, and as Kerry Oliver wishes to lay it down after 3 years we are looking for a new person/people.

Mini Mart has a dual function of raising extra funds for a 'good cause' (the exact causes have changed over the years) and enabling a way of sharing home-grown and home-made produce, home-baking (including baking for people with food intolerance such as to gluten) and finding a new home for good quality books, CDs and bric-a-brac that other people at Meeting may wish to buy.

I have taken on the role of organising Mini Mart for about 3 years. It has been a sociable and enjoyable task for me in that time,

The main requirements have been:

- to be there on the 1st Sunday of the month (or find someone else who can run it if necessary)
- · to set out the donations and produce before Meeting.
- to suggest prices or suggest people donate what they feel is fair
- to ensure that the monthly proceeds are sent to the treasurer
- maintain a small cash float
- ensure everything that is not sold is put away at the end of the Mini-Mart. There is a small amount of space in the cupboard. Anything superfluous to this space that is not sold within a few months goes to a charity shop or is otherwise suitably moved on.

This job would be well suited to being shared by 2 people, which should mean neither would feel overburdened. There have also been months when it has not happened for some reason and that is fine too.

If you want to discuss any aspect of the job please contact Kerry. I would be very happy to do a joint Mini Mart to help someone ease into the role. I am also sure that my way of doing it is not the only or necessarily best way so feel free to be creative with the role!

Knitting and Crocheting Friends

Jane Lewis writes that we are creating a Scottish section of the **Wool against Weapons scarf** that will stretch 7 miles on **16th August 2014** between the Women's Peace Camp at Aldermaston and Burghfield (the other Nuclear Weapons Establishment site) in Berkshire.

The idea is that individuals knit or crochet a scarf (100cm long and 60cm wide) in pink wool on large needles, any design. More at
