Our **Wikipedia Page of the Month** is **Tragacanth Gum** (141 visits/day; 11 edits/year); food additive E413. It is the dried sap of the goat's thorn plant, and has hundreds of uses as emulsifier, thickener, stabiliser in food and pharmaceutical products, and also a herbal remedy. It grows mostly in the Middle East, Iran is the biggest producer. The gum oozes from the plant and dries into flakes which can be powdered. It absorbs water to become a gel, which can be stirred into a paste. It has been in use for at least 2000 years.

**Bonus:** Gum arabic (E414; 939 visits/day, 43 edits/year) oozes from acacia trees across the Sahel from Somalia to Senegal but Sudan is the major source. It is mainly used in food, but also in inks and traditional lithography, and cosmetics. It was used in ancient Egypt 5000 years ago.
