Edinburgh cemeteries (iii): Morningside

Just around the corner from us. The edges of Morningside Cemetery have been eaten away by sales of plots for housing when it was privately owned. Lost areas include the original grand entrance, though its gateposts remain in their original location in Belhaven Terrace. The new entrance is a disappointment, but the interior impressive.



Our Wikipedia page of the month is Morningside Cemetery (90 views per month).

The page has been almost entirely written by Stephen Dickson, who has published an extensive autobiography on his Wikipedia author's page. He reports being trained as an architect and employed by Edinburgh City Council in various roles including Surveyor of Graveyards and Cemeteries. He is a prolific Wikipedian: 8 of what looks like hundreds of contributions are about Edinburgh cemeteries.
