4. Formal Minute regarding change of Treasurer:

We appointed Susan Robertson as Treasurer of South Edinburgh Local Quaker Meeting with immediate effect until 31st December 2019 and authorised the Clerk and current Treasurer to complete the necessary paperwork from the Cooperative Bank, Triodos Bank and Shared Interest to add Susan Robertson as a signatory for these accounts immediately; to add the Clerk as a reserve signatory and to remove Martin Burnell as a signatory.

We agreed that the Current Account should have the name "S Edinburgh Local Quaker Meeting" in place of "S. Edinburgh Meeting of Soc. of Friends".

We also authorised the Clerk and current Treasurer to complete any paperwork necessary to give Susan Robertson online access to the Co-operative Account; and to remove online access from Martin Burnell once the accounts for 2016 have been completed.

We also authorised application to be made for our new Treasurer to be issued with a debit card for use with the Co-operative account.

We very warmly thanked Martin for his 12 years of exceptional service as our Treasurer.

5. Monthly Collections for 2017

We discussed the draft from Susan Robertson and David Somervell and agreed a list as shown [as published in Feb newsletter].

We noted that friends also generously supported Christian Aid with a mini-mart during Christian Aid Week 2016 and plan to do so again in 2017. And we noted that – through sales of allotment and garden produce etc – we have sent much-needed funds to several refugee charities.
