Our Wikipedia Page of the Month is Mary Somerville (1780-1872) (237 visits/day, 36 edits/year). The 'Queen of Nineteenth Century Science' was brought up in the Borders and Fife. Her second husband encouraged her intellectual pursuits, as did professors of maths and natural philosophy in Edinburgh. Her achievements in science and maths were quite remarkable, as was



her recognition, all in the Victorian era with 4 children. Somerville College in Oxford is named after her, as are a room in the Scottish Parliament, a crater on the moon, and other earth-bound and astronomical objects.

Truly a dangerous role model. She won a recent public vote to appear on the RBS £10 note.

What we're watching


