Minutes of Local Meeting for Business, Sunday 20 October 2013

12 Friends were present. During our opening worship we heard from Quaker Faith & Practice 2.68.

Minutes:

Minutes of the Local Business Meeting held on July 21st 2013 have been circulated and would be signed later by the Clerk.

(22/13) – We thank Alison Chalmers for hosting a delightful Bring and Share lunch on Sunday 6th October. This provided an opportunity for many who were not able to go to Wiston to share some time together.

23/13 – Arrangements for holding meetings for worship for church affairs

Several Friends reported on the valuable discussions held after meeting on 29 September. There was not readiness to test the integration of a business meeting with meeting for worship at this stage, but Friends felt that other options could be usefully further explored. We would like to strengthen the sense of worship in our meetings for business, and ask Friends to remind each other of the correct Quaker disciplines for these meetings.

We ask Friends to give further thought to trying an occasional different time for Meeting for Business, and possibly to a limited trial of discussing a single item of business at the end of a Meeting for Worship.

24/13 – Talks after meeting for worship and meetings for learning

Susie Reade reported on the survey requested on Meetings for Learning. We were impressed by the ideas and offers to lead topics, and ask Elders and Overseers to consider how and when to deliver them. We suggest discontinuing after-Meeting talks on other topics (e.g. Getting to Know) for the present, after Anna Mitchell's talk in November.

25/13 – Sustainability policy for Area Meeting

We commend the idea of a Sustainability Policy drafted for AM but do not feel that we have had adequate time to discuss the document due to be considered by AM on Saturday.


NEEDED: COULD THIS BE YOU?
