Minutes of Meeting for Business Sun 18 Oct 2015

Seven Friends were present. During opening worship we heard a short passage – on the process of sharing concerns – from Quaker Faith & Practice 13.09.

Minutes of the 17th May meeting - were circulated and signed by the Clerk. **Matters arising** from the Minutes of previous meeting:

- 16/14 Open Door Board: Susan Freshwater updated us on her role representing our Meeting as non-executive director of the charity which runs our premises. Nigel Griffiths is currently convener and Graham Bennett settling into a rather busy role as Manager replacing Sandra Dickson. Sue hopes to meet shortly with Graham to share ideas on way forward for the organisation.
- 04/15 & 05/15 Quaker Faith and Practice: We welcomed the proposal from Elders and Overseers for two Meetings for Learning one after Sunday worship led by Nicola Read [22 November] and the other an evening one [6-7.30 Wed 9 December] led by Susie Reade.

Both to consider Ch 21 from QF&P: Personal Journey.

The five who have expressed interest in an ongoing study group will be invited to both opportunities. We shall see where the spirit leads after these – and how **Becoming Friends Together** might in due course provide material for sharing.

Matters arising: Matters arising:

- **16/14 Trustee for Open Door Board:** We thanked Susan Freshwater for agreeing to represent us on the charity which runs our premises.
- 04/15 The Spiritual Life of Our Meeting: We agreed that the two recent "Becoming Friends" groups had been very valuable for both the content and the opportunity to meet together. We agreed to extend an invitation to all to express interest in studying "Being Friends Together" material. See http://together.woodbrooke.org.uk
- **05/15 Quaker Faith and Practice:** We have been encouraged by Hilary to regularly reflect on passages from QF&P. We considered how we use our Book of Discipline as part of our preparation for proposed revisions to QF&P.
- 06/15 Tackling economic inequality: Minute 36 from Britain Yearly Meeting 2015: We explored our concerns about the evil of social and economic injustice which creates a world in which the wrong things are valued. We upheld work already being done by Friends and in our name; recognised the way we can fund that work through our annual giving; and noted that the Area Meeting Quaker Social Responsibility Group plan an event in Edinburgh World Justice Festival in October.
- **07/15 Our Annual Accounts for 2014:** Martin Burnell, our Treasurer reported that our income and expenditure are in balance with a small surplus during 2014. We have just under £7,000 in our current account and just over £3,000 in capital accounts invested in Shared Interest and in Triodos.


We noted that we laid down our regular Mini-Mart in Spring 2014.

We thanked Martin for all his careful work as our Treasurer.




