Mary Fell of Lancashire, aged 8, writing in 1665 about her parish minister.

Well that's you told, Lampitt.

Lampitt was a non-conformist minister who George Fox encountered at Swarthmore, and particularly disliked. Mary Fell was one of Margaret (Askew) Fell's 9 children by Judge Fell, so subsequently Fox's stepdaughter.
