## My work in the second Quarter of 2023

We are half way through 2023 and more than halfway through the Summer Holidays. This Summer Holiday have been quiet-ish (as quiet as it can get with a 10 and 7-year-old anyway).

We went to Ireland for a week and enjoyed seeing family and Dublin – we even got to the National Museum of Ireland. We looked at various treasures, but I struggled to find an artifact that had moved me deeply the first time I saw it, nearly 20 years ago.

I ended up discovering it online. The nearly 3500 year old <u>Trundholm Sun Chariot</u>. It must have been on loan from the National Museum of Denmark when I saw it; although I can't find any evidence that it was ever in Ireland.

The only other option is that I saw it in a vivid fever dream brought on by meeting my (then) boyfriend's parents for the first time.

What moved me about this artifact, apart from its striking craftsmanship, beauty and almost modern appearance, was that it was discovered in multiple parts. It was dug up by a farmer in the 1900s. Nearly 100 years later further bits of the chariot were discovered by metal detectorists and reassembled into the whole.

I could try to make a tortured metaphor here to Quakers and Quakerism... Or my husband's family rediscovering their Quaker history, but it would be a stretch. The chariot is a beautiful and very old thing. When I saw it I remember feeling a level of spiritual awe that I sometimes get in places of worship.

Peace at the Heart is an exhibition that has been organised by the Parliamentary Working Group alongside Peace Education Staff working for Britain Yearly Meeting. It will go to the Scottish Parliament 26-28 September. I am helping to plan its tour of Scotland after the exhibition at Holyrood.

It will feature multimedia examples of peacebuilding at the heart of schools, from young peacemakers mediating disputes to action on global issues. Peace artefacts will encourage curiosity and critical thinking. Accompanying workshop opportunities will give children and young people the chance to interact and add to the exhibition.
